MANAGING DIRECTOR'S REPORT

1. CONTRACT WTP-400: DISPOSAL OF LIQUID SLUDGE FROM LOWER BUCKS COUNTY JOINT MUNICIPAL AUTHORITY'S WATER TREATMENT PLANT, TULLYTOWN, BUCKS COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA

We have started preparing sspecifications and contract documents for invitation of bid proposals for the disposal of liquid sludge from the Water Treatment Plant. Generally, we need to dispose of liquid sludge once or twice a year when we clean the flocculation and sedimentation tanks.

2. CONTRACT WWTP-401: REPLACEMENT OF EXISTING CHLORINATION SYSTEM WITH ULTRAVIOLET (UV) DISINFECTION SYSTEM AT WASTEWATER TREAMENT PLANT (CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECT)

We are continuing our evaluation on feasibility and application of different available UV Disinfection Systems for the replacement of the existing Chlorine Disinfection System for the Wastewater Treatment Plant.

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3. CONTRACT WWTP-403: FURNISH AND DELIVER ROCK SALT (SODIUM CHLORIDE) FOR THE 2019-2020 SEASON THROUGH THE BUCKS COUNTY CONSORTIUM-SALT BID

We have completed and submitted the required information for the participation in the Joint Salt Bid through the Bucks County Consortium for the 2019-2020 season. Our estimated use for the 2019-2020 season is approximately 80 tons.

4. DO PARTNERSHIP FOR THE DELAWARE ESTUARY

We attended a meeting on DO Partnership for the Delaware Estuary held on June 18, 2019. The main purpose of this meeting was to discuss science and technology pertaining to DO in the Estuary as it relates to Ammonia Nitrogen discharge from the Wastewater Treatment Plants.

5. CONTRACT WWTP-392: INSTALLATION OF CURED-IN-PLACE SANITARY SEWER LINING IN VARIOUS LOCATIONS - PHASE VI

The Contractor is continuing to make progress. The Contractor has completed cleaning/lining of approximately 28,000 linear feet of sewer mains.

6. CONTRACT WWTP-384: REPLACEMENT OF ROOFING SYSTEMS AND ASSOCIATED WORK ON VARIOUS BUILDINGS AT THE WATER AND WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANTS, LOWER BUCKS COUNTY JOINT MUNICIPAL AUTHORITY

The Contractor is currently working on additional authorized work under the allowances section of the contract involving the rehabilitation of the Low Duty Pump Station Roof at the Water Treatment Plant and the Mechanics Building Roof at the Wastewater Treatment Plant.

7. CONTRACT NO. WWTP-396: FURNISH AND SUPPLY STONE DURING 2019-2020 (PARTICIPATION IN THE 2019-2020 BUCKS COUNTY CONSORTIUM HIGHWAY MATERIALS JOINT BID)

We have issued Notice to Proceed to the Contractor for the above stated Contract

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8. PROJECT WWTP-190: WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT SCADA SYSTEM UPGRADE

We are continuing our required ongoing upgrade/retrofit of the existing PLCs and SCADA System at the Wastewater Treatment Plant.

9. PROJECT WTP 140: WATER TREATMENT PLANT SCADA SYSTEM UPGRADE

We are continuing our required ongoing upgrade/retrofit of the existing PLCs and SCADA System at the Water Treatment Plant.

10. WATER AND WASTEWATER SYSTEMS

The average daily drinking water supplied for the month of May 2019 was approximately 8.86 MGD. The monthly average effluent flow from the Wastewater Treatment Plant for the month of April 2019 was approximately 7.65 MGD.
